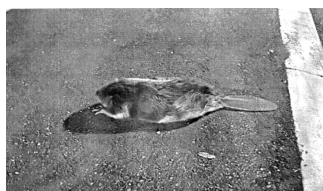

Slow down ... beaver crossing ahead

Police in Washington said a beaver seen blocking traffic on two occasions was "taken into protective custody," but



a second buck-toothed suspect remains on the loose.

The Bellingham Police Department said officers responded to Aldrich Road, north of Bellingham, on a report of two beavers blocking traffic.

One of the animals fled the scene, while its larger cohort remained behind in the road.

The second beaver also fled while officers were awaiting assistance from the Whatcom Humane Society and Washington Fish and Wildlife personnel.

The larger beaver reappeared the next day near Meridian and Telegraph Road "and proceeded to be a traffic hazard," police said on social media.

The beaver was "taken into protective custody" and transported to a Fish and Wildlife facility for examination.

"Hopefully, it will get the help it needs and give up living dangerously on the streets of Bellingham," police wrote.

Car breaks down but big money prize was waiting

Literacy

Literacy and reading are center stage across the country for Read Across America Week, which began on the annual March Read Across America Day.

That includes San Joaquin County where participating classrooms engage students in creative and fun activities for young readers.

It follows the Stockton Rotary Read-In, an annual event where volunteers visit classrooms in dozens of schools to read aloud from favorite books that they leave with the students as a donation.

While showcasing the power of books to unlock new worlds and inspire young minds, Read Across America and the Rotary Read-In also build and strengthen a community focused on reading and literacy. They show our students how much we value reading and its importance to their education as well as provide access to books.

The celebration and learning can carry on throughout the year, even outside of school. Plan a trip to the library with young readers in your life or have a discussion about what they are reading using open-ended questions. Whatever you choose, it's important to have fun and embrace the joy of learning.

It's also never too early to start on the path to literacy. Parents and guardians are a child's first teacher, from infancy until they start school. Talking and singing introduces language. You can also pick a letter and have your child name something around the home that also starts with that letter. Make reading part of your household routine to highlight its

importance.

Literacy is critical to the future of all our children and aligned with ensuring their educational experiences provide equitable access to academic growth and social-emotional development.

Literacy is directly related to job readiness, healthcare access, economic development, and the overall well-being of our entire community. Improving literacy can contribute to economic growth, help reduce poverty, promote critical thinking, and provide individuals with access to information to be engaged in their community.

For students, literacy is the foundation for skills and knowledge to support them on their academic journey. Reading by the third grade is the most critical academic skill for youth because it sets the foundation for future learning and academic success. In grades pre-kindergarten through third, students are learning to read. In fourth grade and beyond, they are reading to learn.

We recently took an important step toward the goal of ensuring students in San Joaquin County become proficient readers by the end of third grade with a declaration of support I have signed along with the superintendents of all 14 San Joaquin County school districts, the president of Teachers College of San Joaquin, and the superintendent/president of San Joaquin Delta College.

This declaration, made in October, affirms each organization's commitment to joining a new Early Literacy Community of Practice and reaffirms their dedication to literacy and building on existing work being done. The newly formed Community of

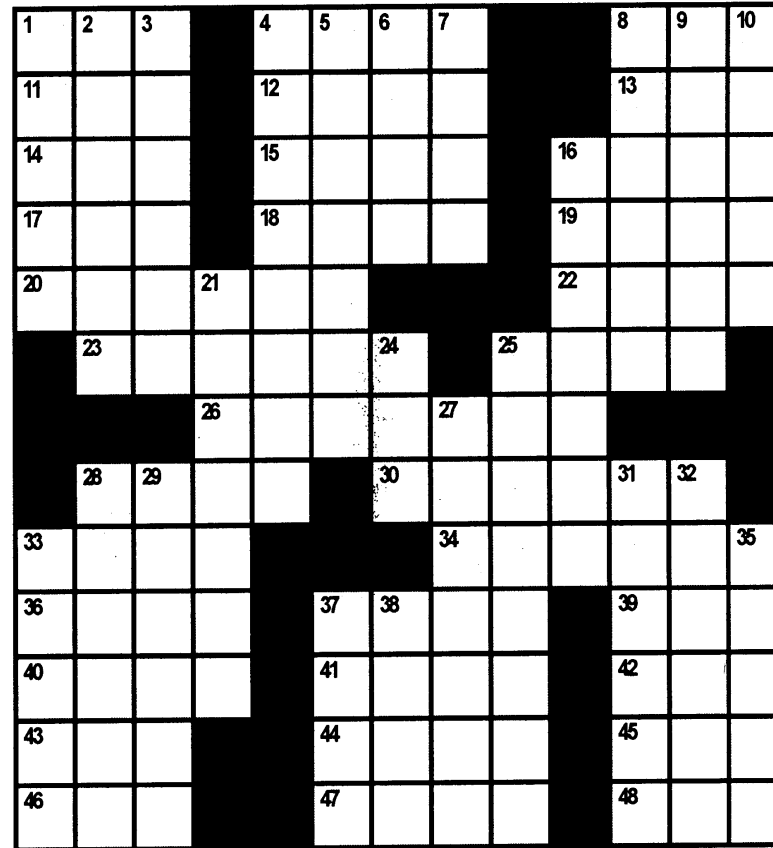

Lights shine more brightly when the night is at its darkest moment. Stars illuminate the skies with more beauty and brilliance when there is no glare from the glow of a city.



Light also brings shadows and can cause blindness. Light even creates illusions of things that do not exist - like streams of water on parched desert sand.

Psalm 36 contains an important theme for the Christian. All too often we willingly accept the teachings of individuals who offer a solution to our problems from sources that are not consistent with God's truth. David clearly warns us about this problem. He writes that we may unwisely "flatter" ourselves because we are "deceived" by not being able to "detect sin." He offers the solution for the method we are to use to discriminate the truth about sin, "in Your light we see light."

John clearly emphasized this also, "God is light," he assures us, "in Him there is no darkness." Light represents what is good, pure, true, holy and reliable. Darkness, on the other hand, represents what is sinful and evil. The light that comes from God's Word is true and reliable and will guide us from the darkness of sin into the Light of God's love, mercy and grace. His Light will save us from the sin of self-deception and death.

Watching a child take his or her first steps is a marvelous sight to behold. Pictures are taken, memories created and lives changed.

Recently a mother and father brought their infant son to the Garden for his first steps. After finding the "perfect" location for this historic event, the father gently placed his hands under the child's arms. As the child looked down at his tiny feet and with uncertainty began to "toddle" forward, the father relaxed his grip. Slowly, as the child began to walk on his own, he removed his hands completely. After a few staggering and uncertain steps the little fellow began to carry his weight on his own two feet. The parents were thrilled!

Suddenly, the child lost his balance and fell to the ground. Rushing to pick him up the father smiled, hugged him and encouraged him to "try again." There was no scolding nor rejection for falling down. Rather, the father lifted him, dried his tears and helped him to begin again.

How like our Heavenly Father. If the Lord is delighted in the way we walk - even though we fall - He will come to our rescue, lift us up and "make our steps firm." As long as we do our part to walk in His ways, He will do His part to give us the stability to "move on."

When we fall, He does not consider us a failure. He lovingly lifts us up, tenderly dries our tears and then carefully watches over us as we struggle to walk in His ways. He will never leave us nor forsake us if we fall,

Letter...

A free, balanced press for democracy

EDITOR, LINDEN HERALD:

It's not surprising, but it is now clear: this November's US presidential election will be Donald Trump v Joe Biden – again. If you're like me, you may at times feel weary about the prospect of living through a bitter replay of a campaign we've seen before. But with so much at stake, both for the United States and the rest of the world, exhaustion is not an option for any of us.

The media will play a crucial role in shaping the outcome of this election – and this time, journalists must get it right. I want to lay out for you how the Guardian approaches our coverage, as it differs from many news organizations.

First, we are unafraid to say plainly that American democracy is facing a unique historic threat. Instead of obsessing about who's up and who's down, our journalists are acutely focused on the real stakes – the fact that fundamental human rights, democracy and the fate of the planet are all on the line.

We take this approach because it reflects our values and what we believe journalism is for in a democracy. With no

billionaire owner or shareholders to please, we are fully editorially independent. That means we are not being pushed by anyone to amp up false scandals for clicks, or cover the election like a reality TV contest.

Without democracy, there can be no free press – and without a free press, there is no democracy. You can help safeguard both by supporting the Guardian as we prepare to cover an election which will have major consequences far beyond US borders.

We always strive to be fair, but we avoid the trap that befalls much of the media, especially in the United States: the tendency to engage in false equivalence in the name of neutrality. Sometimes reporting truthfully means calling out the lies of powerful people and institutions – and making clear how misinformation and demagoguery can damage democracy.

In an era of AI-generated scandal and social media virality, we are acutely aware of how the media can be manipulated to promote political agendas. Our election cover-


she doesn't run and Manchin runs, he would surely glean about 10 percent of President Biden's votes and insure President Biden's loss.

It is hard to believe that we are already in March - the almond blossoms have bloomed and spring is on the way. This year has already seen some great successes with our Board of Supervisors.

In February, the Board approved a plan that Supervisor Tom Patti and I helped develop with our Probation Chief for a new approach to the issue of homelessness in our community. While the new program, known as SJ CARES, won't be a silver bullet to solve this problem, we know that by having accountability and continuity of care, we can impact lives for the better and improve outcomes in our community. Board Opposes AT&T Action at California Public Utilities Commission

The Board of Supervisors voted to oppose the recent application by AT&T to end its responsibilities as the "Carrier of Last Resort" and encourages County residents to contact the California Public Utilities Commission.

San Joaquin County encompasses an area of 1,426 square miles, much of it rural, with seven, potentially eight, cities. Cell service in our county can be spotty with dead zones, areas that don't receive cell signals, either because it's too far from the nearest cell tower, or because it is being blocked by a building or something else in the environment.

The ticket matched four of the drawn numbers and the Powerball, earning him a \$150,000 prize.

The player said he didn't discover the win until he scanned the ticket about a week later.

"My response was very mundane. I had a lot of responsibility to remain calm since it was \$150,000," he said.

Sure looks like an ostrich, doesn't it?

Animal control officers in Colorado were dispatched to round up a reported "ostrich" that turned out to be an escaped emu.

The Weld County Sheriff's Office said animal control officers and patrol deputies re-



sponded Tuesday to a report of an "ostrich in the roadway" in the area of Weld county roads 76 and 33.

"When WCSO arrived, we learned we were not dealing with one of the largest birds in the world, but maybe the second- or third-largest bird in the world (depending on your source), an emu," the sheriff's office said in a Facebook post.

The responders were able to "utilize their 'contain and capture' skills" by wrangling the emu into the fenced-in yard of a willing nearby resident.

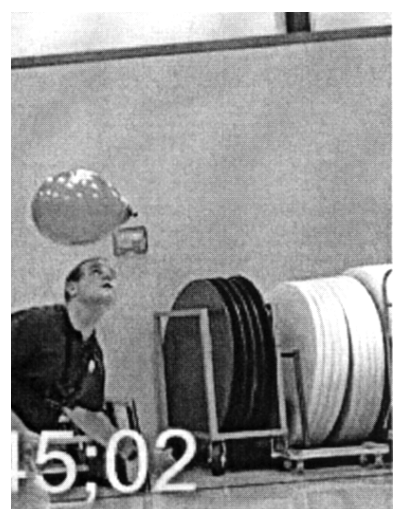
A passerby suggested the emu likely belonged to a local man, Andrew Leffler, who was then contacted by the sheriff's office.

Leffler arrived on the scene and confirmed that the emu, named Buddy, was his escaped pet.

Buddy was safely loaded into a trailer and taken home.

Some people do the strangest things to get recognized

An Idaho man on a mission to become the top Guinness World Record-breaker in the world recaptured one of his old titles using two balloons and his head.



David Rush, who has broken more than 250 Guinness World Records and currently holds 162, first took the title for the longest duration to

keep two balloons in the air with the head in 2018, when he kept the two balloons aloft for 3 minutes, 12 seconds. Rush's record was taken in 2019 by a balloon head-bopper who achieved a time of 6 minutes, 34 seconds.

"This record requires skill, coordination, and concentration," Rush wrote. "The balloons have to be hit alternately, and if one of them pops up and hits the other, it's game over."

Rush said it took him weeks of practice to get back to the point where he could keep two balloons in the air for even a single minute.

He was finally able to retake the record with a time of 13 minutes, 58 seconds.

Rush's goal for 2024 is to become the holder of the most concurrent Guinness World Records titles. The distinction belongs to Italian record-breaker Silvio Sabba, who holds 182 titles.

Don't throw out those 'old' lottery tickets

A Maryland man said he learned a lesson about keeping his truck tidy when a recent clean-out resulted in his finding a \$30,000 Mega Millions ticket among the trash.

The Laurel man told Maryland Lottery officials he bought some tickets for the Oct. 6, 2023, Mega Millions drawing from the Royal Farms store on Harmony Road in Caroline County.

He said the tickets spent months forgotten in his truck and only recently resurfaced while he was cleaning out the vehicle.

The man said he decided he should check the tickets before throwing them away, and was shocked to discover one was a \$30,000 winner.

He said the unexpected windfall will come in handy.

"I plan to pay my bills and invest for my retirement that's right around the corner," he said.

Purple favorite color —but now it might change--greenbacks

An Illinois woman who used her favorite color to select a scratch-off lottery ticket on her birthday scored a \$1 million prize.

The woman told Illinois Lottery officials she stopped at the BP station on South Harlem Avenue in Palos Heights on her birthday to buy some gas, and while inside the store she noticed the \$25 Diamond Crossword 10X ticket was purple, her favorite color.

She decided to buy one of the tickets as a birthday gift to herself.

"When I scratched the ticket in my car, I kept seeing wins that were getting bigger and bigger," the player recalled. "As I got to the end, I realized it was worth \$1 million and I couldn't believe it. I went back into the gas station to double check -- and it was real. I instantly started crying and my legs felt like noodles -- I didn't think I would be able to drive home!"

She described her prize as life-changing.

"My husband and I work hard to provide for our family, and we want to be able to give our kids all the opportunities the world has to offer. This win will make a difference in our lives, and in theirs. Never in a million years did I think my life would in an instant like this," she said.
