The eagle has landed—stuck in a vehicle grille

March 13 (UPI) — Officials in a Maryland county said a bald eagle was lucky to avoid serious injuries when it col-



lided with a car and ended up with its backside stuck in the front grille.

The Calvert County Government said in a Facebook post that an animal control officer and personnel from the Calvert County Sheriff's Office responded when a driver collided with a eagle.

"When the driver stopped, they realized that the eagle was still alive, but trapped in the vehicle's [grille]," the post said.

The animal control officer was able to carefully extract the eagle with help from deputies.

"After a thorough examination, all were relieved to find the bird seemed to be in good health and was quickly released back into the wild," the post said.

Venomous snake found in little girl's bedroom

March 13 (UPI) — An Australian snake catcher was called to a family's home to remove a "highly venomous" snake spotted in a 7-year-old girl's bedroom.

Sunshine Coast Snake Catchers 24/7 said in a Facebook post that a reptile wrangler named Giffo was dispatched to the Morayfield home on a report of a red-bellied black snake on a prowling in a girl's bedroom.

The post included a video showing Giffo locating the snake in an otherwise empty doll bag in the corner of the bedroom.

Big mystery why county chief was fired

The San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors reported out of closed session that Jay Wilverding, the County Administrator, had been placed on leave and that they were seeking an agenda item tot the March 26 meeting to terminate his contract.

The Board indicated that its action "was not for cause." what that means? Four of the supervisors voted to place Wilverding on leave,

pending the next meeting, with Chairman Miguel Villapudua voting no. Sandra Regalo, who serves as the Assistant County Administrator, has been named as the Acting County Administrator.

"While Mr. Wilverding has played a vital and important role in San Joaquin County, the decision of this board signals that it is time for a new direction and new leadership," said Vice Chair Paul Canepa in a press release.

"It is essential that the Board of Supervisors have a close and cooperative relationship with the County Administrator's office, and I am confident in Ms. Regalo's ability to work with our board to ensure that the county is well positioned in the coming weeks as we consider our options for the future of San Joaquin County administration."

Even with their canned statements, the taxpayers will never truly know why Wilverding (whose

annual salary was \$365,801) was fired because the supervisors decide to hear the matter in secret behind closed doors.

The California Brown Act allows certain personnel items to be discussed in secret. But the matters only should involve specific charges or complaints—not job reviews.

The Brown Act was passed into law 71 years ago and authored by Modesto State Legislator Ralph M. Brown requir-

ing that public agencies need to keep the public informed—not in the dark.

Wilverding was appointed as Auditor-Controller 11 years ago following a public interview to fill a vacancy.

He was later elected to that position. In March 2021, he was appointed as the County Administrator by the Board of Supervisors—in total, he has spent 14 years in service to San Joaquin County and its residents.

Vote count is not quite over

California Secretary of State Shirley N. Weber, Ph.D. is reminding Californians that, while Election Day has passed, the vote count process will continue for up to 30 days after the election.

"Doing it right takes precedence over doing it fast," Secretary Weber said. "California is committed to protecting voting rights and has put several guardrails in place to protect those rights, including same day voter registration, provisional ballots, and the postmark-plus-seven days rule for vote-by-mail ballots. By law, county election officials have 30 days to verify voter signatures to determine eligibility, count votes, conduct a post-election audit and report results to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State has up to 38 days after the election to certify the results.

"The time taken to process ballots ensures voters' rights and the integrity of the election."

Election results will change throughout the canvass period as vote-by-mail ballots, provisional ballots, and other ballots are processed. The frequency of updated results will vary based on the size of each county and the process each county elections office uses to tally and report votes.

County elections officials must report their final results to the Secretary of State by April 5. The Secretary of State will certify the results by April 12, 2024.

The extraordinary Christian is always seeking ways to grow into the likeness of Christ, to follow His teachings and to worship Him daily.

An evangelist was visiting with a group of missionaries in South America. He asked them many questions about their work, their families, the natives in that particular country and what they missed most while they were away from their families and friends.

As he was concluding his visit, he asked one final question: "What is the greatest problem you face in your work as missionaries?" The answer surprised him.

"Inconsistent Christians," they replied. "The way they live confuses the unsaved because they are one way one day and another way the next day. They come between God and the sinner and make our work difficult!"

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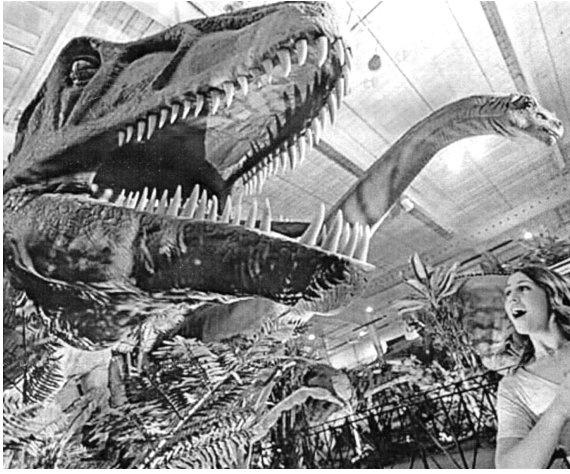

Lake Amador, renowned for its unique breeds of cuttbow, rainbow and "Amador Gold" trout, produced a nearly 20-pound rainbow on Saturday, March 6, setting a new record for the reservoir.

Bartoni drove from San Ramon to the Mother Lode lake near Ione to enjoy the sunny weather and do some trolling for trout on the reservoir.

"Little did he know the fish gods would be smiling upon him that day when he hooked and landed the biggest trout of his life and set the new lake rainbow record at the same time," said Elizabeth Lockhart at the Lake Amador Resort.

Weighing in at 19.96 pounds, this rainbow trout crushed the previous record of 19.30 pounds by over a half pound. Richard was top-line trolling from a boat at the mouth of Jackson Creek with a bronze/gold Rapala on 4-pound test line when the monster fish hit his lure. The fish measured 32.4 inches in length, 22 inches in girth and 9.5 inches in height, accord-

ing to Lockhart.

However, the fish still is not the biggest trout ever caught at Amador. Those honors go to Juan Garcia of El Dorado, who landed a 20.12-pound cuttbow trout, a hybrid between a rainbow and cutthroat, on Veterans Day 2020.

That fish measured 32.5 inches in length and 24 inches in girth – and 10 inches in height. Garcia was fishing with

chartreuse Berkley PowerBait at the dam when he hooked the lunger.

So whether you fish from shore or from a boat, you have a chance to catch a giant trout at Amador.

Amador's trout are raised on site in the lake's fish hatchery. The facility has raised a total of 22,450 pounds of trout, a mixture of cutbows,

rainbows and "Amador Golds" from October 15, 2020 to present. An average of 1,000 pounds of trout are being planted weekly.

In addition to three breeds of trout, Lake Amador also features largemouth bass, crappie, redear sunfish, bluegill and catfish to anglers pursue. Information: (209) 274-4739.

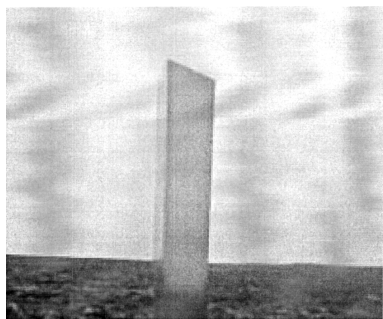

**A worldwide prank—
or a message from
another universe?**

March 12 (UPI) — A mysterious silver monolith has been found on a Welsh hillside, evoking memories of when similar structures appeared around the world in 2020.

Richard Haynes said he was



out for a run on Hay Bluff, near Hay-on-Wye. Powys, when he came across the 10-foot-tall metal monolith.

“I thought it looked a bit bizarre and might be a scientific media research thing collecting rainwater,” Haynes told WalesOnline. “But then realized it was way too tall and strange for that.”

“Then I went up to it and it was about 10 feet tall at least and triangular, definitely stainless steel. It was hollow and I imagine pretty light — light enough for two people to carry it up and plant it in the ground.”

The column is similar to a monolith discovered in a southwest Utah desert in 2020. The monolith was followed by further discoveries in locations including California, Texas, Florida, Wisconsin, Romania and England’s Isle of Wight.

An anonymous art collective called The Most Famous Artist later took credit for several of the U.S.-based monoliths.

No one has come forward to claim responsibility for the Welsh monolith.

**Toilet paper

March 12 (UPI) — The California Highway Patrol said there were brief traffic delays on a highway when a pickup truck spilled hundreds of rolls of toilet paper onto the roadway.

The CHP said three boxes of toilet paper fell from the back of the Ford F-350 on the Interstate 5 Freeway near Calgrove Boulevard in Santa Clarita about 12:20 p.m. Monday.

Footage from the scene shows traffic backed up as CHP officers throw rolls of toilet paper over the cement barrier separating the roadway from a construction site.

The CHP said the toilet paper mess was mostly cleared by 12:40 p.m.

March 12 (UPI) — A British Columbia animal shelter said a stray dog was brought in after taking a solo ride on a com-

muter train.

New Westminster Animal Services said the dog was found unattended aboard a train at Sapperton Skytrain



Station and is believed to have boarded at New Westminster Station.

Skytrain attendants captured the Boston Terrier and turned the canine over to animal services.

The shelter is now trying to identify the dog’s owner so it can be sent home. Officials said the canine will be held for 96 hours before its owner loses the right to reclaim it.

“We can then make the best decision for the animal — adoption, foster transfer, etc. It has only been 24 hours since the dog was impounded, so we are optimistic that an owner will come forward,” an animal services spokesperson told Daily Hive.

**Cat comes home
from feline commune**

March 13 (UPI) — A Georgia woman’s cat was missing for 7 years before being found living with a colony of strays about a mile from home.

Liz Gillespie said her lynx



point Siamese mix, named for basketball star Kevin Durant, went missing from her Rock Spring home about 7 years ago.

“I live next door to 30 acres and woods. And so I just kind of assumed that maybe a coyote had gotten him, and I really didn’t think he was out there after so long. I kind of didn’t have any hope left,” Gillespie told WTVC.

Gillespie said she was shocked to receive a call from the Walker County Animal Shelter reporting that Kevin had been found.

Officials told her the feline had been brought in for testing after a confrontation with a local child, and veterinarians discovered he was neutered and microchipped.

She said Kevin had been living in the feral cats colony only about a mile from her home.

The North Georgia Animal Alliance, where Gillespie works as a volunteer, said in a Facebook post that the now-12-year-old cat is being treated for a minor upper respiratory infection, but is otherwise in good health.

**Surprise, surprise!—
good will
and \$18,000 later**

March 12 (UPI) — A 14-karat gold Lego piece donated to a Pennsylvania Goodwill store was originally priced at \$15 — but ended up selling for over \$18,000.

Goodwill officials said workers at the store in Du Bois

were sorting through a bag of jewelry transferred from the State College Goodwill store when they found the Lego piece, a small Bionicle mask.

“You wouldn’t think any-



thing of it. It came in a little old-looking Lego box,” Chad Smith, the vice president of e-commerce and technology for Goodwill in North Central Pennsylvania, told People.

He said the piece was initially listed online for \$14.95.

“We didn’t know it was worth anything until people started asking if they could buy it for \$1,000,” Smith told WPVI-TV. Workers researched the piece and discovered it was an extremely rare “Kanohi Hau” mask. Lego created only 30 of the gold masks.

“It was a giveaway, and there were 25, I believe, that were given away and five remained for people who actually worked at Lego. So 23 years later, one of these resurfaces and it’s really unique,” Smith told KDKA-TV.

Goodwill auctioned the piece and it ended up being sold for \$18,100 to an anonymous collector.

The gold mask is now believed to be the most expensive Lego piece ever sold, taking the title from a 14-karat solid gold 2x4 brick that sold for \$15,000.

**2-yr-old can
out smart
Mom & Dad**

A 2-year-old Kentucky girl proved she has intelligence beyond her years by becoming the youngest-ever member of high-IQ society Mensa.

Guinness World Records said Isla McNabb of Crestwood was accepted into Mensa after scoring in the 99th percentile of intelligence for her age group on the Stanford-Binet Intelligence Scales.

Mensa is the largest high-IQ society in the world, and members must score at the 98th percentile or higher on a standardized IQ test to be eligible. Parents Jason and Amanda McNabb said Isla learned her alphabet at the age of 18 months and was soon reading. “At seven months of age she would pick out certain items from picture books when asked,” Jason McNabb told Guinness World Records. The parents said they enrolled Isla in Mensa in the hope of finding resources to nurture her talents.

“The biggest benefit to Mensa is the community,” Jason McNabb said.

Editor, Linden Herald:

It’s not surprising, but it is now clear: this November’s US presidential election will be Donald Trump v Joe Biden – again. If you’re like me, you may at times feel weary about the prospect of living through a bitter replay of a campaign we’ve seen before. But with so much at stake, both for the United States and the rest of the world, exhaustion is not an option for any of us.

The media will play a crucial role in shaping the outcome of this election – and this time, journalists must get it right. I want to lay out for you how the Guardian approaches our coverage, as it differs from many news organizations. First, we are unafraid to say plainly that American democracy is facing a unique historic threat. Instead of obsessing about who’s up and who’s down, our journalists are acutely focused on the real stakes – the fact that fundamental human rights, democracy and the fate of the planet are all on the line.

We take this approach because it reflects our values and what we believe journalism is for in a democracy. With no billionaire owner or shareholders to please, we are fully editorially independent. That means we are not being pushed by anyone to amp up false scandals for clicks, or cover the election like a reality TV contest.

Without democracy, there can be no free press – and without a free press, there is no democracy. You can help safeguard both by supporting the Guardian as we prepare to cover an election which will have major consequences far beyond US borders.

We always strive to be fair, but we avoid the trap that befalls much of the media, especially in the United States: the tendency to engage in false equivalence in the name of neutrality. Sometimes reporting truthfully means calling out the lies of powerful people and institutions – and making clear how misinformation and demagoguery can damage democracy.

In an era of AI-generated scandal and social media virality, we are acutely aware of how the media can be manipulated to promote political agendas. Our election coverage is in many ways defined by what we choose not to cover: amplifying false scandals drummed up by opposition researchers, platforming lies and misinformation, and engaging in “he said-she said” coverage without adequate context.
