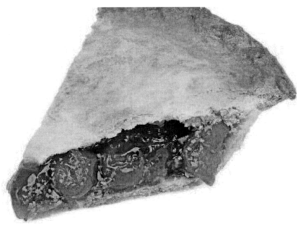

#### Cherry pie finally gets long-awaited reprieve

March 14 (UPI) — The U.S. Food and Drug Administration is marking Pi Day with a decision



that it will no longer hold frozen cherry pie to a higher standard than other frozen or fruit pies. Pi Day, an annual celebration of the mathematical constant  $\pi$ , is observed March 14 since 3, 1 and 4 are the first three significant figures of pi, the ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter.

Last week, the FDA announced it would be revoking the standards of identity and quality for frozen cherry pies, saying they were no longer needed to ensure the products meet consumer expectations.

The agency's decision comes after years of lobbying by organizations like the American Baker's Association, which argued the regulations are outdated and have disproportionately affected the baking industry by not anticipating innovation and the rapid change of consumer tastes.

In a statement, the FDA said revoking the standards would provide greater flexibility and the opportunity for product innovation, an action that "supports FDA's goal to modernize standards of identity."

The rule, the FDA noted, will go into effect April 15.

Frozen cherry pie has been the only variety of fruit pie or frozen fruit pie that required separate standards.

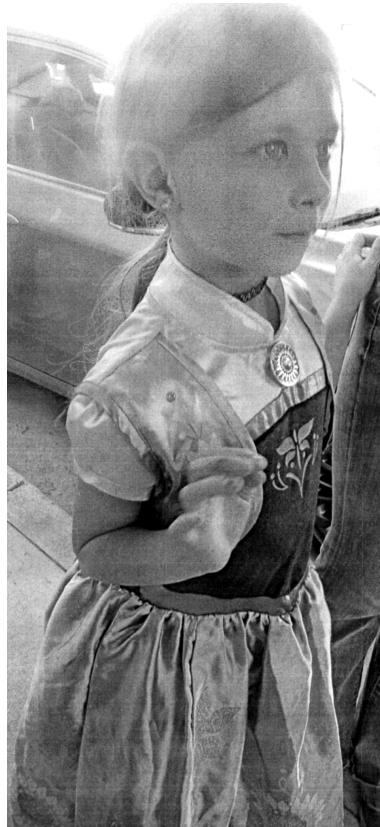

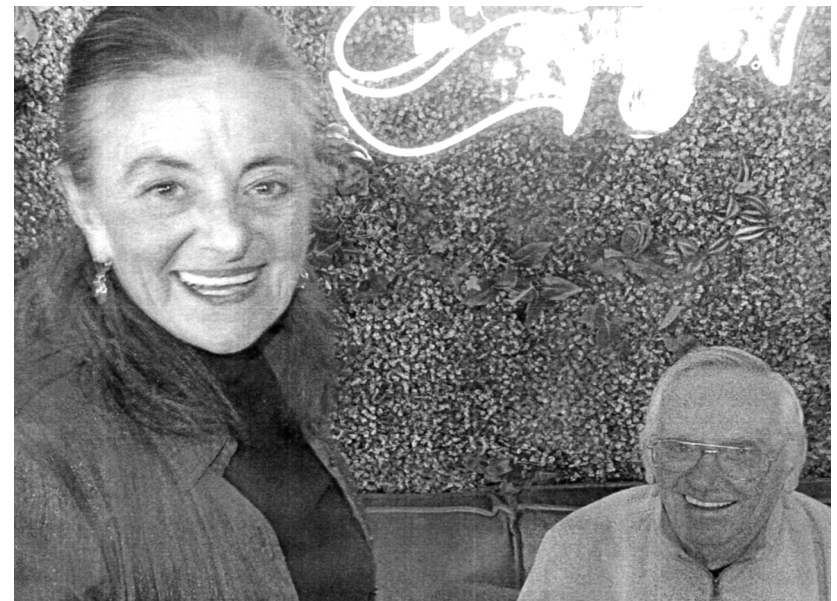

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
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# Educator was inspirational

Dear Friends,

Don Shalvey, the Co-CEO of San Joaquin A+, long-time resident of San Joaquin County, and national educational trailblazer for more than a half century, died Saturday at the age of 79.

Don was an amazing leader, educator, person, and friend - and he lived a life that touched many people, as is exemplified by the outpouring of support he has received in the last few days, which we encourage you to read below.

We at San Joaquin A+ know our work together was just a part of the great story of his life, and the arc of impactful work he did in education over the last 50 years. We will treasure the fact that he chose to use his last years to build an organization and team to serve our youth in Stockton and San Joaquin County. He truly believed right through his health battles last year that if we bring people together from local school districts, charter schools, non-profit organizations, businesses, and county governments to collaborate, we can improve education here in a way that will create a brighter future for the students of this region.

As Don said after leaving the Gates Foundation to relaunch

A+: "Here in the San Joaquin Valley, the quality of what we cultivate - our grapes, walnuts, cherries, and tomatoes - is known for being among the very best in the world. We envision a world where our education system is known for the same high quality, where we cultivate minds as well as we cultivate crops."

And as a long-time resident of Linden, this sentiment was deeply personal. He enjoyed nothing more than inviting local educators and leaders over to sit under a tree on his ranch to solve problems big and small, and sometimes just to get to know each other a little bit better. We know many of you had similar experiences, and we encourage you to share them with us as we look for more ways to honor and celebrate his legacy in the coming weeks and months.

He is survived here in the county by his wife Sue, who also is a lifelong educator, and two children: his daughter Megan (another educator), along with her husband Luke and his granddaughter Grace, and his son Brian, a former Navy SEAL and a current Pacific student. They appreciate all of the well-wishes they are receiving and are celebrating his memory privately with

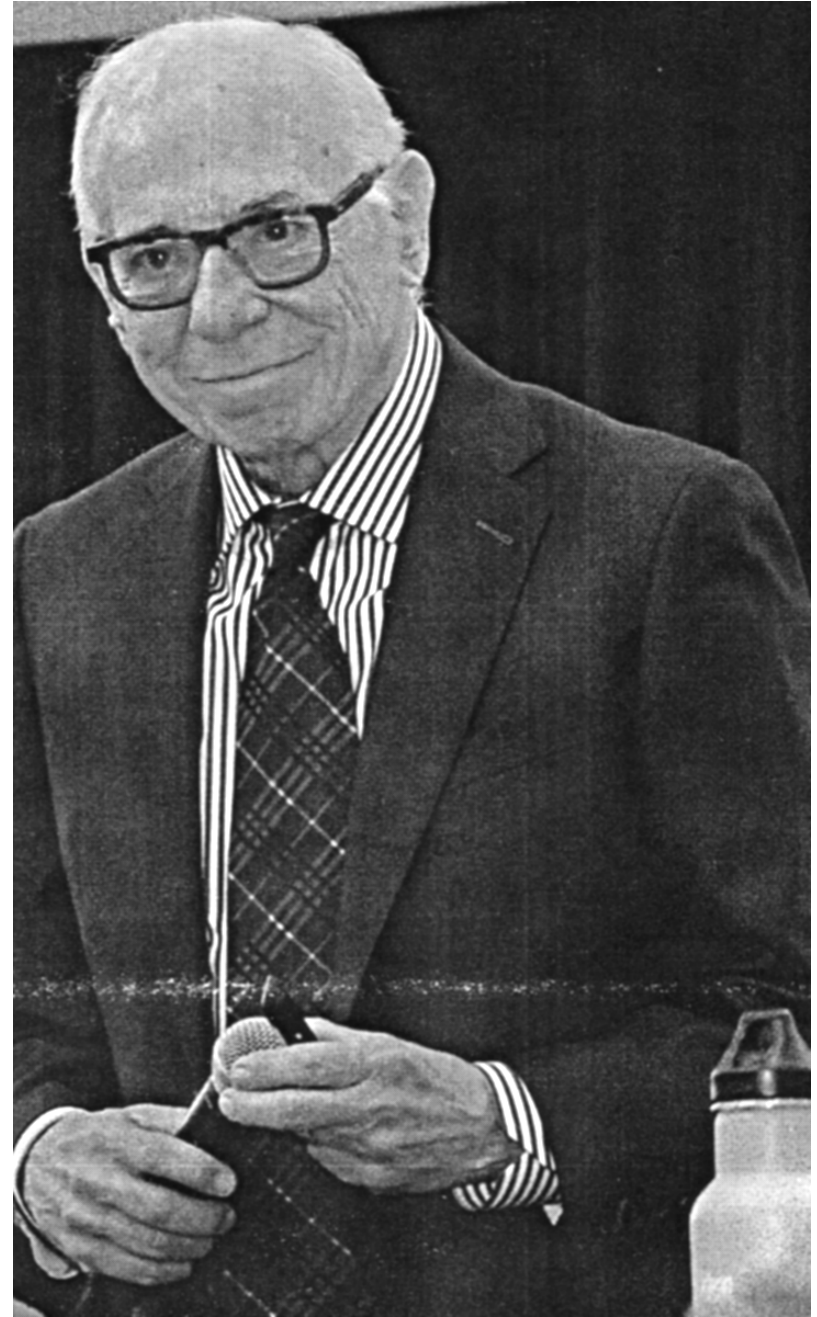
family at this time. They have shared that they are planning a public memorial in the coming months. We will share this information when it is available.

You might have thought by now I might have run out of things to talk about. I haven't. I never will as long as there are my friends around. But today's topic takes the cake. It's about something we don't talk much about in polite society. It's about Feet. My feet.

As you may suppose from the title of this article, you must know, by now, I am going to tell you about my new beautiful, comfortable House Slippers. In all my life of receiving nice presents, two of the nicest gifts were from my dear neighbor, who, from time to time, sends over apple pies and walnuts from her orchard.

Linda, who owns the farm next door, must have second sight. First, the outstanding Author's pen she gave me for my birthday was so fine, I only use it to sign the books I wrote, and on rare occasions so it won't wear out too fast. The couple said the well-preserved letters date from 1934, 1935, 1936 and 1937 and were addressed to Miss Rhoda Taylor.

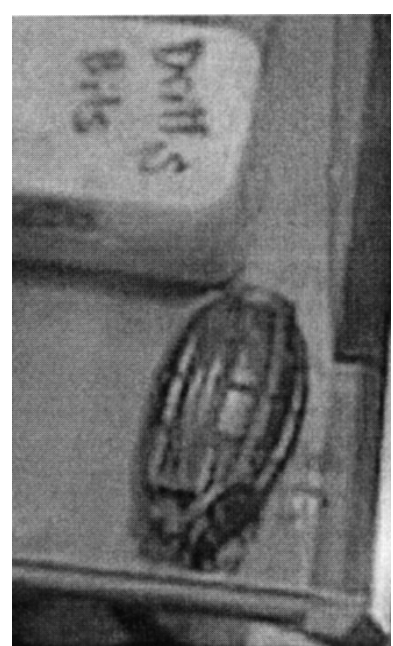
The couple contacted the previous owners of the house, but they did not have any information about anyone with that name.

March 18 (UPI) — Army personnel were called to a Quebec home when the deceased owner's daughter made a surprising discovery in a toolbox: a live grenade.

Kedrin Simms Brachman said she and some family members were cleaning out



the Knowlton home formerly occupied by her father, Frank Simms, who died in October.

"We went into his tool room, which was always, like, nobody ever went into his tool room. That was a sacred place," she told CTV News. "I was looking for something, and then I opened up the toolbox, and there was a grenade."

Simms Brachman said she remembered the grenade from decades earlier, but had thought it was long gone.

"I remember this grenade from almost 30 years ago when Dad brought it back from my grandfather's house," she wrote on social media. "We all asked him to get rid of it and thought he had...well, he

didn't and it was loose and had moved houses multiple times with him."

Simms Brachman contacted police, and an officer who arrived to take photos of the object said Canadian Armed Forces would need to be summoned to the house.

**Cops chase down  
a pig on the run**

March 14 (UPI) — A loose pig led Louisiana sheriff's deputies on a "brief foot pursuit" before a "farm-raised" deputy was able to rope the runaway animal.

The St. Tammany Parish Sheriff's Office said four pigs were spotted on the loose in the Dixie Ranch Road area of Slidell, and three were quickly captured.

The bobbleheads were to be distributed before the Penguins host the San Jose Sharks at 7 p.m. EDT Thursday at PPG Paints Arena in Pittsburgh.
